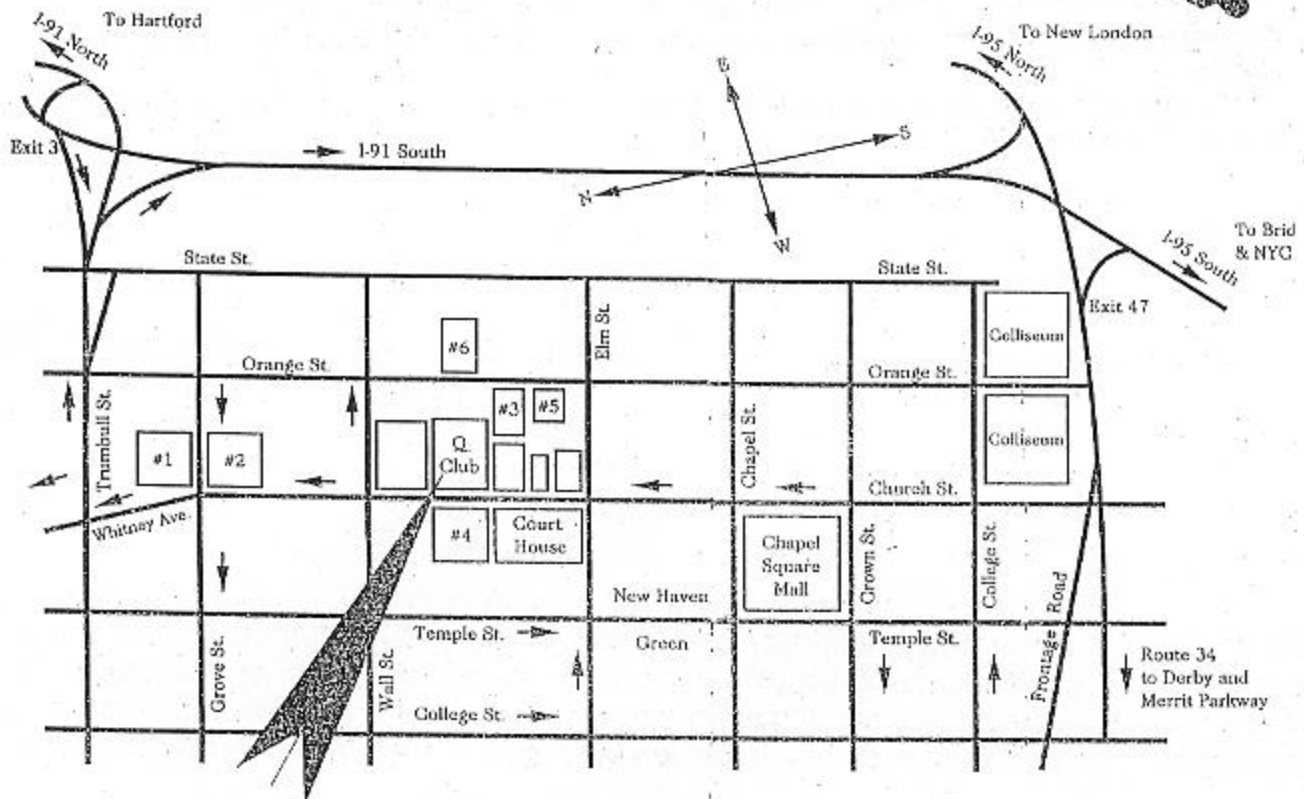

COMPATRIOT BIOGRAPHY: **George Ira Lancraft VI** has been a member of the SAR Since 1939. His roots in New Haven are deep. There is Lancraft Street in Fair Haven and of course there is the Lancraft Fife and Drum Corps. Before the Revolutionary War, the first George Lancraft designed and built the lighthouse at Lighthouse Point and the Old Stone Church in East Haven. George has lived in Bethany and Essex and currently resides in Madison.

His working life included employment with Pratt Whitney, the Pratt Read Company, Barrows and Wallace Real Estate and Lancraft Real Estate Agency in Old Saybrook. George served in both the Atlantic and Pacific Theaters in the Army in World War II. He served the Town of Old Saybrook as Trial Justice. George piloted his own plane and we know he has played the spoons when the Banjo Band has been with us.

George's first wife Sara McCallip died. Four children have seen adulthood. Currently, he and Bonnie Frazier Lancraft have been sharing many happy years together.

DIRECTIONS

From I-95: North or Southbound. Take Exit #47 Route 34 (Oak Street Connector). Take Exit #1 Downtown, turn right on to Church Street.. 4.5 Blocks. Just past the Green. Quinnipiack Club is on the right. You may park on the Street in Front or Park in lot #4 on the left behind the Court House. It is not recommended to Park in the Garages as they may close early.

From I-91: Southbound. Take Exit #3. At the end of the ramp turn right on to Orange Street. Go 3 blocks. Cross Wall Street (Trinity Lutheran Church is on the corner) Turn right in to the third driveway. This Lot #3 behind the office building which offers free parking at night. Walk through to Church Street. The Q Club entrance is to your right. It is not recommended to park in the Garages as they may close early.
