COMPATRIOT BIOGRAPHY: **George O. Ellis** was born in Waterbury, has lived in Naugatuck and now resides in Cheshire. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Geology at Brown University. He also did some graduate work in Geology at Yale. George flew as Navigator on a B-17 in World War II. He flew 35 missions with the 8th Air Force. He was awarded the Air Medal with 6 Oak Leaf Clusters, Distinguished Flying Cross, European Theater Ribbon with 4 Battle Stars and a Presidential Unit Citation. In 1947, he married Peggy Needham. They have 3 children: Mark, Renee and Kent. George worked for Schlumberger for 25 years in geological engineering and managerial positions around the United States. He spent 18 years with the Eastern Water Development Company in Connecticut. George has written a biography of Revolutionary War General David Wooster who lived in New Haven. He has also served Branch #1 as program chair.
