

Report of the CTSSAR Eagle Scout Patriotic Program: September 19, 2020

This year has been an exceptional year where we received 7 applications for this program. We also had to create an alternate plan for the recognition ceremonies due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The alternative plan utilized outdoor venues to conduct the Eagle Scout recognition ceremonies by the branches and the state. All of the ceremonies were very successful via an atmosphere of celebration and social distancing.

This year's applications were a split between 2 BSA Councils: 4 of 7 applications were from the Connecticut Rivers Council [CRC] and the remaining 3 were from Connecticut Yankee Council [CYC]. A CTSSAR review team of four compatriots was assembled to review the applications. We thank them for their support.

- An outdoor ceremony to recognize Jason Luciani, T907 Woodbridge [CYC] – by the Humphreys Branch No. 1 was held in the East Side Cemetery in Woodbridge where his Eagle Scout Project was done on July 13, 2020 at 6:30 PM.
